What is this workshop about? *Early Career Teaching Workshop: Developing your Scholarship* is a workshop designed for early career teachers to share and reflect on their experiences of teaching and supporting students. Additionally, this event seeks to encourage awareness of teaching-focused career pathways and will see delegates design and evaluate their own teaching initiatives in groups with feedback from senior teaching staff. The workshop will conclude with a (free!) wine reception and tea/coffee will be provided throughout.

Who/what are we looking for? Is there something that you do in your teaching that others might be interested in? Have you adapted your teaching practices to benefit students' learning or wellbeing? Do you have any novel techniques for incorporating employability into your teaching? It doesn't matter how big or small, we want to hear from you!

We are looking to invite three speakers with teaching responsibilities from *any* discipline across RHUL to present on a teaching initiative or strategy, event, etc they have implemented within their department. Each speaker will be allocated a 10-minute slot to present and to take questions. If you are interested, please send a two-sentence summary of your project/event/strategy, whatever it may be to THESIS@rhul.ac.uk no later than 15th May 2023. The organising committee will select three speakers from the submitted summaries and the invited speakers will each receive a £25 gift voucher as a token of our appreciation.
