The School of Humanities runs a research skills training programme aimed at equipping PGRs across the School with the skills they need to successfully complete their studies. Students in their First Year are strongly encouraged to attend as many sessions as possible.

Masters by Research in the Department of English

The word count for a non-practice-based MA in English by Research should be around 30,000-35,000 words in length.

Word count for a practice-based MA in English by Research:

- In the fields of practice-based research where the student has undertaken research in creative writing or poetic practice the dissertation will be completed according to Appendix 1 of the Research Degree regulations, paragraph 5(2) with the dissertation comprising a minimum of 15,000 words and a maximum of 20,000 words to be submitted alongside a body of creative work devised specifically for the degree. Both elements will show coherence, originality and intellectual rigour, illustrating knowledge and understanding of relevant practice and critical debates in the field. The relationship between the creative and critical/theoretical components will vary depending on the specific project. The exact balance between the creative work and dissertation of the thesis will be decided between the student and supervisor and discussed at the outset of the project; though in all cases the dissertation must be a minimum of 15,000 words and a maximum of 20,000 words.
- Fiction / Literary Non-Fiction: 15,000–20,000 words of fiction to be completed alongside the dissertation

•	Poetry and Poetic Practice: 15-20 pages of poetry or equivalent practice-based output to be completed alongside the dissertation
