The College greatly values its Honorary Members and their contribution to the life of the institution and hopes that those accepting the honours today find fulfilment for many years to come in their association with Royal Holloway.

The Ceremonial College Mace

The Ceremonial College Mace was created by Elizabeth Matthews, a local goldsmith. The design symbolises the Victorian heritage of both Royal Holloway and Bedford Colleges and also represents the College's present status as a multidisciplinary university institution committed to excellence in all its areas of activity. It is based on the Octagon of the Founder's Building. The head of the Mace, knobs and handholds are in gold-plated silver and the shaft is made of rosewood; this represents the contrast of the red brick, characteristic of the Founder's Building, with the Portland Stone of the Octagon. The College Crest has been embossed in enamel onto the floor of the replica of the Octagon.

Honorary Fellows



Mr L. Preston Bryant Jr was awarded an MA in English Literary Studies from Royal Holloway in 1990. He is a founding member and President of the Royal Holloway and Bedford College American Foundation. Preston is Senior Vice-President for Economic and Infrastructure Development at McGuire Woods Consulting, where he advises on a wide range of issues including water and wastewater facilities, conventional and renewable energy, and commercial and industrial development. From 2005 to 2010 Preston was Secretary of Natural Resources for the Commonwealth of Virginia and led the state's six environmental, recreational, wildlife, and historic resources agencies with a staff of nearly 2,500 and a budget of approximately \$400 million. In 2009 he was appointed by President Obama as Chairman of the National Capital Planning Commission, the central agency for all federal lands and buildings in Washington, DC, Maryland and Northern Virginia.



Ms Janice Hadlow is a Royal Holloway College alumna who has retained links with the Department of Media Arts, which she opened in its revamped venue in 2005. Since 2008 Janet has been Controller of BBC2. She was Controller of BBC4 from 2004 until 2008 where successes included 'Lost Decade', 'Inside the Medieval Mind', 'Edwardians', 'Atom', 'Parallel Lives', 'Blood and Guts', 'Arts of Eternity', 'Genius of Photography', 'The Chatterley Affair', 'Vivaldi's Women' and 'Fear of Fanny'. The channel's achievements have been recognised with awards for Non-terrestrial Channel of the Year (Broadcast 2008, MGEITF 2006). During Janice's tenure, BBC4 created high-profile themed seasons which have transformed the impact of the factual. Drama grew into one of the key treasures of the schedule and music programming reached new heights of popularity.



The Lady Heseltine is a Bedford College alumna (BA French and German). In the 1990s she agreed to be one of the original patrons of the Annual Fund. Anne is an art historian, having taken courses at the Courtauld and Christie's. She co-ran an art gallery in St James's and has been a Trustee of the National Gallery since 2008. Previously she was a Trustee of both the Victoria and Albert Museum and the Imperial War Museum. From 1988 to 2007 the

Lady Heseltine was on the Board of Visitors for the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford, becoming Chair of its Fundraising Committee and a Fellow of the Museum. In 1999 she received the Distinguished Friend of Oxford Award from the University of Oxford in recognition of her fundraising.



Professor Fred Piper is an internationally recognised authority on cryptography and information security. Prior to the 1970s cryptography was regarded as a ‘black art’ practised almost exclusively by governments, the military and financial institutions. Fred was one of the main forces in the drive to make cryptography more widely understood not only by practitioners but also by academics and the general public. Fred was awarded a First Class Honours degree in Mathematics at Imperial College in 1962 followed by a PhD in 1964. He is Director of the Royal Holloway Information Security Group that was awarded the Queen’s Anniversary Prize for Higher and Further Education in 1998. Fred has served on a number of committees offering security advice to the UK’s Department of Trade and Industry. In 2002 he was awarded the first, and so far the only one, honorary CISSP for a European, for leadership in information security. Fred is a member of the Board of Trustees at Bletchley Park.



Professor Jim Rose joined Royal Holloway in 1989 as Head of the Department of Geography. Under his leadership the Department became one of the top Geography Departments in the UK with a worldwide reputation. Within his field of research Jim has contributed to our understanding of how glaciers and rivers shape the landscape and how the landscape has changed over recent geological time, including the discovery of the largest river that existed in Britain before glaciations. This discovery subsequently proved to be of significance in providing the evidence for the earliest humans in northern latitudes, which has totally changed our understanding of human activity and development. Jim has also acted as member and chair of research councils committees, deputy chair of UK and Netherlands Research Assessment Exercises for Geography and Earth Sciences respectively, Earth Science Advisor to Natural England and a member of Council of Royal Holloway.
