Note on Plagiarism:

A series of short quotations from several different sources, if not clearly identified as such, constitutes plagiarism just as much as does a single unacknowledged long quotation from a single source. Use of another's computer program or data without acknowledgement also constitutes plagiarism. Equally, a summary of another person's ideas or judgements must be referred to and the work referred to included in the bibliography. Failure to observe these rules may result in the allegation of cheating. Students should therefore consult their tutor or course director if they are in doubt about what is permissible.
