Fairness and Assurance Policy 2020/21 including clarification in respect of the carry forward of Emergency Regulations from 2019/20 to 2020/21

1. Carry forward of Emergency Regulations 2019/20 and New Regulations 2020/21

- (1) In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, Emergency Regulations were approved for the 2019/20 academic year. The Emergency Regulations formalised the communications which had been sent to students in respect of the steps taken by College to ensure students were not academically disadvantaged and included the College's policies of "Best 90/ Best Credits" and the provision of a "Safety Net". Whilst the Emergency Regulations were introduced for the academic year 2019/20 only, there are particular aspects of the regulations, set out below, which will need to be carried forward to the academic year 2020/21. This approach was approved by Executive Board on the 10 November 2020.
- (2) References below to 'Retaking' encompasses all students retaking their year of study, whether through Resits (Capped and Uncapped), Repeats, First Sits or Deferred Assessments. Retaking students will retain the Emergency Regulations they were first assessed under irrespective of the number of credits they are retaking.

2. Mitigations for the Academic Year 2020/21

- (1) For the academic year 2020/21, in addition to the changes made to teaching and assessment, a series of further protections have been introduced as follows to ensure students are not academically disadvantaged:
- (a) The FHEQ level requirements set out in Section 15 Part B of the <u>Undergraduate Regulations</u> 2020/21 for students to pass a specified number of credits at each FHEQ level in order to progress or to be awarded have been removed.
- (b) The progression requirement for Undergraduate students in the academic year 2021/22 to pass, be allowed or be granted exemption from modules in the first and second stages of study to the value of 210 credits has been removed. This means that students are allowed to carry up to 30 credits worth of condonable fails from each stage. A condonable fail is a Fail outcome of at least 30%. Any modules designated as mandatory (non-condonable) in the course specification must be passed with a mark of 40% or above.
- (c) The introduction of a 'Safety Net' calculation for all 2021/22 Second and Third Year (non-finalist) students which will be undertaken when students come to be awarded. A final average will be calculated to ensure the mark for the Second or Third Year (completed in 2020/21) cannot lower the final classification.
- (d) The development of the 'Safety Net' calculation for students who took a Year Abroad or a Year in Industry as detailed below for each cohort at points 3.1- 3.3 of Table 1.

This approach was approved by Executive Board on the 20 January 2021.

3. Extensions

- (1) The current <u>Extensions Policy</u> on what constitutes acceptable grounds for an extension remains in place, with the exception of IT issues which are not normally accepted but will for the academic year 2020/21 be considered on a case by case basis.
- (2) There will be a relaxation of the requirement for students to provide supporting evidence in respect of 10-day extensions. Students must at least provide a statement and if they are

already in receipt of evidence it is important to provide this. However, students should not actively seek letters from the NHS/medical profession/ professions involved in the Covid Response to support their application if they have not already been provided to them.

- (3) Where the College has asked a student to self-isolate and this impacts their ability to complete an assessment, due to Covid 19 symptoms or lack of access to necessary resources, the email sent by the College advising them to self-isolate would be accepted as evidence for an extension.
- (4) The number of self-certified 5-day extensions will be increased to 2 per term, from 2 per Academic Year. Any extensions requested in relation to deadlines from Monday 7 - Friday 18 December 2020 will not count towards the maximum limit on the number of five-day self-certified extensions granted in the term.
- (5) Clustering of assessments will continue to be monitored so that one self-certified application may be applied to several assessments which are due to be submitted at the same time.
- (6) Additional arrangements have been put in place for the period at the end of the Autumn Term to accommodate the Government's student travel window.

4. Extenuating Circumstances

- (1) The current <u>Extenuating Circumstances guidance</u> on what constitutes acceptable extenuating circumstances remains in place, with the exception of IT issues which are not normally accepted but will for the academic year 2020/21 be considered on a case by case basis.
- (2) There will be a relaxation of the requirement for students to provide supporting evidence in respect of extenuating circumstances as set out in Appendix B of Extenuating Circumstances Guidance for Students. Students must at least provide a statement and if they are already in receipt of evidence it is important to provide this. However, students should not actively seek letters from the NHS/medical profession/ professions involved in the Covid Response to support their application if they have not already been provided to them.
- (3) Where the College has asked a student to self-isolate and this demonstrably impacted their ability to complete an assessment, due to Covid 19 symptoms or lack of access to necessary resources, the email sent by the College advising them to self-isolate would be accepted as evidence.

5. Resit Opportunities for the Academic Year 2020/21

- (1) All students who either do not submit work, or who submit and receive failing marks¹, for summative assessments (coursework and examinations) in the Academic Year 2020-21 will be offered a further attempt at the assessment.
- (2) Undergraduates: For first attempts and repeat attempts, a First Sit/ First Sit for repeat will be offered. For students on resit attempts, a First Sit for resit will be offered, however students will not receive an overall percentage mark greater than 40% for that module. For students who have received a penalty under Sections 6-8 of the <u>Regulations on Academic</u> <u>Misconduct</u> any resit attempt where permitted will be capped.

¹ which results in an overall failed module mark.

- (3) Postgraduate Taught: For first attempts and repeat attempts students will be offered an uncapped resit. For students on resit attempts, a capped resit will be offered. For students who have received a penalty under Sections 6-8 of the <u>Regulations on Academic</u> <u>Misconduct</u> any resit attempt where permitted will be capped.
- (4) Students who have passed a module may exceptionally be permitted to make a further attempt at that particular module on the recommendation of the Department Assessment Board.
- (5) Finalists who have passed a module and been classified may exceptionally apply to the Chair of the relevant Departmental Assessment Board and the Chair of the School Progression and Award Board for a further attempt at that particular module. The approval of such an application will normally only be given if a further attempt may result in an improvement to the overall degree classification of the applicant.
- (6) Students will not be billed a fee for any further attempts offered to them by the Department Assessment Board as a First Sit/First Sit for Resit/Repeat for Undergraduates or a capped/uncapped resit for Postgraduate Taught students.

6. Use of Module Review and Scaling

(1) Where module assessments have been affected or where the marks for student performance are out of line with previous cohorts, the Department Assessment Board and /or the School Progression and Awards Board may, in exceptional circumstances, scale marks from completed assessments in cases other than those set out in Sections 14 of the <u>Undergraduate Regulations</u> 2020-21 /Postgraduate Taught Regulations 2020-21.

7. Examination Boards

- (1) In the case of Department Assessment Boards, Section 9 of the Emergency Regulations 2019/20 will continue to apply for the academic year 2020/21.
- (2) In the case of School Progression and Awards Boards, Section 10 of the Emergency Regulations 2019/20 will continue to apply for the academic year 2020/21.

8. Progression and awards within programmes

(1) Progression in respect of undergraduate provision

(i) Where an Allowed outcome for a module was returned in 2019/20 or 2020/21 it will not count towards the limit upon the number of Allowed (AL) outcomes permitted across the course.

(ii) Students who interrupted in the year 2019/20 will be treated as retakers for the year of study they interrupted if they interrupted after 1st March 2020. Students who interrupted before this time will be subject to the standard 2020/21 Regulations for the year of study.

(iii) **Table 1** below sets out how progression requirements will apply for the academic year 2020/21 in respect of undergraduate provision.

(2) Classification requirements in respect of undergraduate provision

(i) Undergraduate Part-time students who began a year stage in the year 2019/20 will be considered under the 2019/20 Regulations for the year stage. For these students the Best 90/120 policies will apply across all modules contributing to the particular stage at which the student is studying. A distinction will not be made as to which academic year a particular module was taken in.

(ii) For undergraduate Joint and Major/Minor Students (All Years), the Best 90/120 policies are not subject specific and so will apply across all modules that a student has taken. Therefore Joint and Major/Minor students could have the full 30 credits of one of their subjects discounted and no credits of their second subject discounted in the calculation of the final average. This would not impact on the degree title, provided all other requirements for the degree title, such as passing mandatory non-condonable modules, are met.

(iii) **Table 2** below sets out how classification requirements will apply for the academic year 2020/21 in respect of undergraduate provision.
