#### I. Overview of intentions/activity

Prior to the award, I was accepted by two conferences in the US. The first of these is International Studies Association's Annual Convention, in Atlanta, USA; the second is of Popular Culture Association/American Culture Association's Annual Conference in Seattle, USA. Although my main aim was to attend both of them, following a unique possibility of an interview in NYC, I decided to make the interview in NY, rather than the second conference attendance in Seattle. First of all, the interview is more important for my studies than attending to the conference. Second, time wise and financial wise, NYC option was more suitable, as I was become aware of the positive outcome of the Award after the first conference. Hence, thanks to the Santander Travel Award, I attended the ISA 2016 conference, presented two papers, and made my interviews in NYC.

# II. In preparation for the trip abroad

I booked my ticket from American Airlines and they costed me £750. I booked three different rooms through Airbnb during my travels for accommodate myself, and they costed me a total of £300.

## III. Upon arrival/specific activities

I arrived a day before the conference and for my first presentation was the first day of the conference, I had to replan and rehearse my presentation. Following the day the conference ended, I moved to NYC and met my contact to initiate the interview. I also found the chance to visit 9/11 sites for its relevance to my interview. Thanks to these travels, I found the opportunity to present my research to my international colleagues, received their feedback, elicited data out of my interviews and published a book chapter with in Turkish. Moreover, thanks to my liaisons in those days with international colleagues, I arranged a post-doc possibility.
