Getting Here

By Car: The College is on the A30, 19 miles from central London and a mile south-west of the town of Eqham.

Directions from the M25: Exit at Junction 13, follow the A30 west (signposted Bagshot and Camberley). Continue on the A30 up Egham Hill; the main entrance is on the left immediately after the second footbridge.

Directions from the west: Leave the M3 at Junction 3 north and follow the A30 towards Staines and London. Continue on the A30 with Virginia Water lake on your left; go straight through the set of traffic lights and the main entrance will be on your right.

By Train: It takes 40 minutes to get to Egham from Waterloo and there are 2-4 trains every hour. It takes 40 minutes to get to Egham from Reading and there are four trains every hour. For help planning your journey visit **www.nationalrail.co.uk**

When you get to the station...

Bus: There is a College bus service which runs between Egham railway station and the campus and this journey is free for UCAS day visitors. Turn left out of the station by the playing fields for the bus stop.

Walk: Campus is approximately 20 minutes by foot. Turn right out of the station, walking towards the traffic lights and turn left. Follow the road to the large roundabout and turn left up Egham Hill. Continue walking up Egham Hill, the main entrance is on the left immediately after the second footbridge.

Taxi: There is a taxi rank at the station. Fares to campus are approximately £7.

Car parking

On your arrival, our marshals will direct you to available parking spaces. Please note that UCAS days are held on working days at our campus and parking could be limited on certain dates.

Local area

Why not give yourself enough time to explore the local area and get a feel for what it's like to live nearby? This is where many of our students live in their second and final years.

Egham Town Centre: 20 minutes' walk from the campus, Egham town has a variety of shops, services, restaurants and a supermarket.

Englefield Green: 5 minutes' walk from the campus, Englefield Green has a village feel with convenient shops, restaurants, takeaways and pubs, local amenities, churches and community groups.

Staines-upon-Thames: 15 minutes by car/bus or 5 minutes by train from Egham, Staines has high street shops and department stores, a cinema, leisure centre and bars and restaurants.

Windsor Town: 20 minutes by bus or car, Windsor is a popular location for students with great shopping and attractions such as Windsor Castle, one of the official residences of the royal family.

London: Students can enjoy all the attractions of central London, approximately 40 minutes from Egham by train.


