Leadership Opportunities:

- Beavers: Assistant Leader- Mondays 6-7.15pm during term time

Roles: As helpers at unit nights and at other occasions, as uniformed leaders or as maintenance crew. The ideal volunteer would be reliable, responsible, understanding and patient. Volunteers should like to have fun with young people whilst working hard, be able to work with children, and have common sense. Volunteers will develop skills in working with children, teamwork, preparing activities for young children, risk assessing activities and first aid etc.

Training: As adults, volunteers get some 'supervision' to ensure safety of all. Training is available through as much as they can attend by District/County Scouts Association.

Location: Scout HQ, Kings Lane, Englefield Green.

Times: Beavers meet Mondays 6-7:15pm; Cubs meet Wednesdays 6:45-8:15pm; Scouts meet Fridays 7:30-9pm during Surrey school term dates

Other: This project has accessibility.
